Re:	Search Continues for Missing 'At Risk' Adult in Yolo County

Yolo County Sheriff's Department is asking for the public's help in finding Chee Tse, who has been missing since Wednesday, July 2nd.

She is described as an Asian woman, age 77, 5 feet 2 inches tall, 110 pounds, with black hair and brown eyes. Ms. Tse speaks only Cantonese and has had health issues.

Chee Tse left home on Tuesday, July 1st at eight in the morning and was last seen Wednesday at five in the evening, walking eastbound on Highway 16 from the Cache Creek Casino in Brooks.

The Sheriff's Department was notified that Chee Tse was missing at approximately five-thirty last night. At that time Sheriff Deputies, along with the Rumsey and Guinda Fire Departments, began a thorough search of the area.

"We are working diligently to find Ms. Tse soon, alive, and doing well." said Yolo County Sheriff Ed Prieto.

This morning Yolo County Sheriff's Department on duty deputies, along with Yolo County Sheriff volunteers, Rumsey Rancheria Fire Department volunteers, Sheriff's Department posse and other area agencies, continue a major search operation for the missing 'at risk' woman.

We are requesting that this information is circulated throughout the Sacramento Region and the bay area networks in hopes of locating Chee Tse. Anyone with information regarding her whereabouts should contact the Yolo County Sheriff's Department at (530) 668-5280 or a local law enforcement agency.
