Two new deputies were sworn in at the Yolo County Sheriff's Department on Monday, July 21, 2008. Deputy Evan Alder successfully completed the Sacramento County Sheriff's Training Academy on Thursday, July 17<sup>th</sup>; Deputy Lech Garcia graduated from the same academy in February 2008.

Deputy Alder comes from a military family; his father was a navigator in the United States Air Force. Deputy Alder received a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice at Sacramento State University in 2006. After graduation, he continued to work at the state university until he was given the opportunity to attend the academy and work for the Yolo County Sheriff's Department.
