**Subject: Burglary Suspects Interrupted By Homeowner**

On 06-04-11 at about 7:30 PM Deputies from the Yolo County Sheriff's Office were dispatched to respond to a burglary occurring on County Road 27, a short distance north of the town of Winters. The homeowner told dispatchers they arrived home to find three suspects, not known to them in a U-haul pick up truck burglarizing their home. There was a brief confrontation at the home between the owners and the suspects.

The suspects attempted to flee the area in the U-haul truck, chased by the homeowner in another vehicle and a family friend in a second vehicle. During the chase the vehicle driven by the homeowner was rammed, causing the airbags to deploy. It was disabled at the scene of the burglary. One subject in the vehicle with the homeowner was injured as a result of the airbags deploying. The second vehicle continued the chase until they lost contact with the suspects near the Winters city limits. The second vehicle continued south to Highway 505 at Wolfskill Road where it too became disabled and had to be towed.

The suspects were later intercepted on Creekside Way by officers from the Winters Police Department. Kimberly Ferguson, 49 years old, Hollie Perez, 31 years old and Shawn Ovalles, 42 years old, all of Fairfield were detained until deputies arrived. Subsequent to the investigation all three were placed under arrest for conspiracy, attempted burglary, possession of burglary tools and trespassing. Ovalles was additionally arrested for assault with a deadly weapon for ramming the U-Haul into the victims' vehicle. All three were taken to the Yolo County jail.
