Subject: Up to \$2,500 reward to find person who decapitated two dogs in Yolo County (RedRover steps in to encourage potential tipsters to come forward)

Knights Landing, CA (June7, 2013) – RedRover, a national nonprofit animal protection organization based in Sacramento, California, is offering a \$2,500 reward for information leading to the arrest and arraignment of whoever killed and decapitated two dogs.

On Thursday, June 6, Yolo County Sheriff's deputies responded to a home in Knight Landing where they found the decapitated and disemboweled body of a Chihuahua inside a car parked on the driveway. This was the second time that the horrific remains of a dog had been discovered on the property. Although not previously reported, two weeks ago the head of a different dog, a terrier, was found inside a boat parked at the home. Only the owners of the Chihuahua have been found at this time.

"The Sheriff's Office is saddened by these incidents and would appreciate anyone with information about animal cruelty crimes coming forward," said Vicky Fletcher, Animal Services Officer with Yolo County Sheriff's Office.

"We hope our reward will encourage someone who knows more about these horrifying acts of animal cruelty to come forward with information that could solve this crime and make the community safer," said RedRover President and CEO Nicole Forsyth. "Violence towards animals is often a precursor to violence towards people, so Knights Landing residents have a stake in seeing that whoever committed this illegal act is punished to the full extent of the law.
