The Yolo County Sheriff's Office Cadets had success during a competition and team-building exercise this past weekend.

The Cadets participated in the 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Central Valley Explorer Competition in Tracy, California. Over the course of three days the Cadets were faced with sixteen different law enforcement scenarios, earning a 1<sup>st</sup> Place prize in the Vehicle Search category. Sheriff Prieto and the entire Sheriff's Office congratulates the Cadets on the hard work and dedication that went into earning this award. Our Cadet Advisors were thrilled with the effort and teamwork demonstrated by the Cadets during the competition.

The Cadet Program is chartered as Explorer Post #910, by the Boy Scouts of America Learning for Life Law Enforcement Explorer Program and is sponsored by the Yolo County Sheriff's Office. In order to meet the program goals, the cadets receive continuous law enforcement training and work experience. Trainings are held bimonthly at the Sheriff's Office and feature a wide variety of subjects. Work experience is obtained from providing actual service at various events and functions at the local level including directing traffic, parking, crowd control, and giving assistance when requested such as helping to locate missing persons. Cadets are required to spend five hours per month attending meetings and training in addition to maintaining a minimum 2.0 grade point average for all courses taken.
