**Subject: Five Arrested After Burglarizing Cannabis Cultivation Site**

Five arrests were made outside Woodland after a burglary at a cannabis cultivation site was reported in the Rumsey area.

On February 28, 2019, at approximately 2:50am, deputies were dispatched to a burglary on the 14000 block of County Road 41a. During the response, deputies were provided with a description of the involved vehicle and learned the theft involved a large quantity of processed marijuana. Twenty minutes after the call was dispatched, deputies located the suspect vehicle just west of Woodland and initiated a vehicle stop.

The bed of the suspect vehicle was found to contain 184 pounds of processed marijuana that was determined to have been stolen from the scene of the burglary. The value of the marijuana was estimated at approximately \$129,000.

Chad Hart, 26, Terrell McCall, 20, and Salvador Rodriguez, 31, all of Sacramento, were booked into the Yolo County Jail. Two 17-year-old juveniles, both from Sacramento, were booked into the Juvenile Detention Facility. All five suspects are facing charges of burglary, grand theft, and conspiracy.
